Per your e-mail of August 4, 2010, INVISTA is resending the summary of the July 29, 2010 oil sheen with your arrival time corrected. INVISTA also corrected the date in the e-mail subject line.

On July 29, 2010 at approximately 3:57 p.m. an INVISTA employee observed an oil sheen on the South river. The INVISTA internal alarm was sounded at 4:05 p.m. The City of Waynesboro Fire Department was contacted at 4:06 p.m. and the National Response Center was contacted at 4:23 p.m. (NRC Case Number 949322). Lisa Oosteen – City of Waynesboro Environmental Coordinator and Mike Crocker, City of Waynesboro Storm Water Manager were also contacted.

The City of Waynesboro contacted Nonna Good, DEQ, Pollution Response Coordinator, at 4:55 p.m. Ms. Good was at the Waynesboro site at 5:45 p.m.

The INVISTA investigation determined that the oil sheen was entering the river through INVISTA Outfall 003, however the source of the oil was not from INVISTA. Outfall 003 drains storm water from a small, relatively inactive portion of the Waynesboro site, portions of Delphine Avenue, and an industrial neighbor.

Immediately after the internal alarm was sounded, INVISTA began looking for the source of oil. On the Waynesboro site, INVISTA visually inspected the storm drains and surface areas around unused shops (known as the Hill shops), the < 90 day storage pad and loading docks (C-Pad area), the railroad track on the southern perimeter of the site and the “plant-eastern” portion of the employee parking lot. INVISTA also inspected a neighboring industry storm water pipe that discharges onto the INVISTA site and through Outfall 003. In addition to inspecting areas on the site, INVISTA and the City of Waynesboro inspected the storm drain on Delphine Avenue. No evidence an oil spill was observed in any of the inspected areas.

At the time of the incident, there had been a very intense rain event and storm water was flowing through Outfall 003. As INVISTA has determined that the oil was not from the INVISTA site, it is believed that the oil was transported in storm water runoff through Outfall 003 from off-site locations.



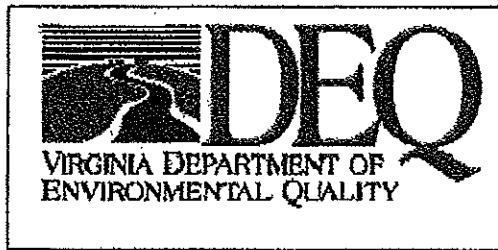

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MEMORANDUM

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On 7/29/10 Waynesboro Fire Dept. requested that a DEQ staff member come to the scene of a petroleum release from an unknown source. The Waynesboro Fire Dept. stated that the South River at the INVISTA plant had approximately 200 gallons of a petroleum product in the river and that INVISTA was ruled out as the source. I arrived at the scene (400 Dupont Blvd., Waynesboro, VA) at approximately 1745 hours. I met with several INVISTA staff, and Gary Critzer, Brian Campbell, and Lesa Osteen with the City of Waynesboro.

It was reported to me that before my arrival, an extensive investigation of the INVISTA plant and surrounding areas of the City of Waynesboro had been conducted and Lesa Osteen, Superintendent of Regulatory Compliance for the City of Waynesboro. The Waynesboro Fire Dept. and INVISTA had deployed absorbent booms and pads into the impacted areas of the South River. No source could be determined.

Lesla Osteen reported there had been a severe storm which had moved over the area and the storm lasted approximately 25 to 30 minutes with strong winds and lightening. The product entered the South River from the storm water discharge pipe located at the INVISTA plant (Outfall 003); however, as stated previously, the search by INVISTA staff of the plant found no evidence of any spills of product at drains at their facility that could have entered into this storm water pipe.

At the security entrance area of the plant, I observed the absorbent booms and pads at this location. There was a petroleum product odor at this area. It was not strong but could be detected. There was also a sheen on the water at this section of the river.

I was accompanied by INVISTA staff up to their Outfall 003. This outfall pipe runs under the plant from Delphine Ave. At this area, I observed more absorbent booms and pads. There was a very slight sheen on the water and a very faint petroleum odor. I was then escorted to the storm water pipe leading from the neighboring Mohawk plant onto the INVISTA property. Here there was no evidence of any petroleum product -- no odor, staining or sheen of any kind -- and there was storm water still flowing from this pipe on to INVISTA property.

I did not observe any evidence of spills at any of the areas we covered at the INVISTA plant - no drums that were stored that could have spilled, no vehicles around that could have leaked, etc. I determined that I would contact an environmental clean up company to perform clean up using VEERF funding. I was able to contact Wayne Thompson with RKM Enviro clean. I explained to Mr. Thompson the nature of the incident and what activities would need to be done at the site. I told Mr. Thompson since there were no stressed or dead aquatic fauna that an assessment could be

done the following morning. Mr. Thompson stated he would get in contact with Rick Mast, owner of RKM Enviro clean, to make a site visit on the morning of 7/30/10.

I informed INVISTA staff that Mr. Mast would be coming in the morning, that the booms should stay in place for at least 3 rain events since the storm pipe could not be washed out, and that Enviro clean would be restocking their supplies. All INVISTA staff members were very cooperative and helpful during the event. I departed the scene at approximately 1915.

I requested a statement from Ms. Osteen about her investigation activities of the surrounding area around the INVISTA plant. I received this statement on 7/30/10 via email. I appreciate all of Ms. Osteen's efforts to locate the origin of the product.

Rick Mast with RKM Enviro clean performed a site assessment on the morning of 7/30/10. The VEERF contract was completed on 7/30/10 and turned into appropriate DEQ staff.

Nonna,

Yesterday at about 4:10pm employees of Invista noticed a sheen on the river. At that time city emergency personnel were called in to assist.

Immediately prior to the spill a harsh storm passed through Waynesboro lasting 25-30 minutes in length and involved strong winds and violent lightning.

Looking for a source of the spill several employees from Invista checked their lines and determined that the spill was coming through the underground drainage pipe that release through their #3 outfall pipe. They tried to trace it past their property but found no apparent cause.

I went up into the neighborhood that would drain into that area looking for an overturned barrel, a home heating tank that may have been dislodged or some sign or trace of the spills origin. I did not see anything out of order or anything that would lead me to the spills starting point. One thing to note is the Quarles automated filling station had just finished off loading when Invista personnel were walking the property which was immediately following the storm. However when I went to the property I did not see any trace of a fuel spill, no odor, no residue or sheen on puddles.

At this time we are not able to determine the cause of the spill.

We appreciate your assistance last night. Please let me know what else I can do to assist you.
